STAMFORD HOUSE

AN ICON WITH AN ILLUSTRIOUS PAST

The Stamford House, designed by Regent Alfred John Bidwell of Swan & Maclaren, the most prestigious architectural practice in town at the turn of the 20th century, was constructed in 1904, following a style inspired by late-Victorian freestyle classicism. The site was used as Singapore's earliest department stores, as a hotel, and as an up-market shopping centre, before the building was gazetted for conservation in 2007.

1933 marks the completion of neo-classical-styled Capitol Building as an extension of the Capitol Theatre, which was built to house apartments designed after the elegant 19th century buildings of Paris and New York. With a striking facade and portico facing the road junction, the building became the backdrop to one of Singapore's most recognisable street corners.

Today, the architecture of the two historic buildings have been masterfully restored and skillfully integrated with modern touches to unveil as The Capitol Kempinski Hotel Singapore. Blending a century of history with contemporary beauty and elegance, this exclusive haven promises luxury at its finest.
